

# GOLF FIXTURES 2020

## GOLF BOOKING AND CANCELLATION PROCEDURES

### 1. REGULATIONS

- 1.1 Timesheets regulating play on the golf course shall be applied at all times and shall be varied only at the discretion of the management. When timesheets are in force, only players whose names appear on them may play on the golf course.
- 1.2 A minimum of 3 players are required in each flight for weekday/weekend/public holiday games. Single/2-ball players will be placed on the waiting list.
- 1.3 The Club reserves the right to slot in players to fill any vacant slot and to pair up any single/2-ball players where applicable. This shall not be applicable for Local Reciprocal arrangements.
- 1.4 The member making the booking is responsible for the flight and shall ensure that all players in this flight turn up on time.

### 2. BOOKING PROCEDURES

#### 2.1 Weekday Bookings

Bookings can be made in person from 9am – 6pm daily, by phone 9am – 12noon and 2pm – 6pm, through email or online booking system. Any email or call before 9am shall not be considered. Booking hours will be extended till 9pm on days where night golfing is available.

#### 2.2 Weekend/Public Holiday Bookings

Gold/Silver Members may book in advance, starting from Friday at 5pm in person for the subsequent Weekend & Public Holidays. Each member is only entitled to book 1 flight per day per session on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### 2.3 Advance Bookings & Private Competition Bookings

For advance bookings, please call 6750 2102. For private competition bookings, please call 6750 2166.

#### 2.4 Single/2-Ball Player(s)

The Club reserves the right to pair up or fill any vacant slots in these flights. Single players have no standing and may be slotted into a 2 or 3-ball flight.

#### 2.5.1 a. 2-ball booking on first and last time-slot of weekday timesheet

	Am Session	Pm Session
i. First time slot	7.07am	12.01pm
ii. Last time slot	8.59am	1.53pm

#### b. Booking timesheet (refer to paragraph 2.1)

Timesheet booking for weekdays can be made 10 days in advance; subject to availability and pairing by the Club to form a minimum of 3 or 4-ball flight.

A minimum of 3-ball or 4-ball flight is required for such booking. NO PROXY bookings are allowed.

#### c. Club pairing service

Members with fewer than 3-ball in their group may also register interest to play during timesheet, subject to pairing up with other golfers by the Golf Reception. Once matching is available, golfers will be informed of their tee time.

The Club reserves the right to pair other loose Balls to form a minimum 3-ball and up to 4-ball to fill the vacant slots in these flight. In the event that there is no other golfer(s) to be paired in a flight, the 2-ball may be assigned a tee-time at the discretion of the Head of Golf or in his/her absence, Golf Operation Executive after assessing the timesheet and course conditions.

#### d. Notice to inform members

Members shall be notified of the results of pairing by the Club within two days or 48 hours prior to the actual date of play.

#### 2.5.2 a. General play on Monday and Tuesday evening (9-hole play)

Members may walk in to register for play with the Golf Reception on the day of play based on a first-come, first-served basis.

##### Normal arrangement

- \*Walking course: after timesheet or from 4.27pm to 5.58pm
- \*Buggy course: after timesheet or from 4.27pm to 5.16pm

##### Ad hoc arrangement (for general play affected by corporate events)

- \*Buggy course: after timesheet or from 4.27pm to 4.41pm
- \*Walking course: after timesheet or from 4.48pm to 5.58pm

#### b. Allocation of tee-time

Based on walk-in registration sequence, the tee-time shall be determined by the Starter. Members who tee off late may play as many holes until the course lightings are turned off.

#### c. Club pairing service

Starters are authorised to pair the golfers up to form a minimum 3 or 4-ball flight. If pairing is not possible, the 2-ball play may be allowed to tee off only after everyone else has teed off.

In the event that the course is not crowded, the Head of Golf or in his/her absence, the Golf Operation Executive has the authority to permit 2-ball play and empower the Starter to execute accordingly.

#### d. Private tournament event day

Should a Private Tournament be held on a Monday and/or Tuesday, one 9-hole course shall be opened to allow for 9-hole evening play on buggy or walking unless otherwise stated. The first three time slots shall be reserved for play on buggy and the remaining by walking.

#### e. Course lightings

For courses assigned for walking, the course lightings for the last 3 holes will be turned on from 7.30pm till 8pm. Management has the discretion to adjust the timing of the course lightings according to the seasonal day light change. No course lightings will be turned on for play on buggy.

#### 2.5.3 a. Sunday evening timesheet (9-hole play)

- \* Walking course: From 4.27pm to 5.58pm (assignment of two 9-hole courses unless otherwise stated)
- \* Buggy course: From 4.27pm to 5.16pm (assignment of one 9-hole course unless otherwise stated)

#### b. Booking timesheet (refer to paragraph 2.2)

Timesheet booking for Sundays can be made 10 days in advance; subject to availability and pairing by the Club to form a minimum of 3 or 4-ball flight.

#### c. Club pairing service (refer to paragraph 2.5.1c)

The Club reserves the right to pair other two balls to form a minimum of 3-ball and up to 4-ball to fill the vacant slots in this flight. In the event that there is no other golfer(s) to be paired in a flight, the two balls may be assigned a tee-time at the discretion of the Head of Golf or in his/her absence, Senior Golf Operation Executive after assessing the course condition.

#### d. Notice to inform members (refer to paragraph 2.5.1d)

Members shall be notified of the results of pairing by the Club within two days or 48 hours prior to the actual date of play.

#### e. Walk-ins

2-ball walk-ins are allowed to tee off during timesheet subject to availability of the tee slots, condition of the course and at the discretion of the Head of Golf or in his/her absence, Golf Operation Executive.

#### f. Course lighting (refer to paragraph 2.5.2e)

For courses assigned for walking, the course lightings for the last 3 holes will be turned on from 7.30pm till 8pm. Management has the discretion to adjust the timing of the course lightings according to the seasonal day light change. No course lightings will be turned on for play on buggy.

#### 2.6 Cancellation for Social Play

If a booked flight is unable to play, the Golf Registration Counter must be notified by email at least 48 hours before the date of play for weekends/public holidays and 24 hours for weekdays. Late cancellation charges will apply for failure to comply with these rules. These rules also apply to bookings made less than 48 hours for weekends/public holidays and less than 24 hours for weekdays.

#### 2.7 Cancellation of Participation for Club Organised Golf Events

Cancellation of participation shall NOT be allowed after the closing date and there shall be NO refund of golfing charges and entry fee.

#### 2.8 Safety Precautions & Golf Etiquette

To further mitigate the safety risk so that golfers will better enjoy their game, the Club had since put in place:

- a. Ongoing review of signages will be conducted to remind golfers to drive their buggy with care near water area and bridges.
- b. Golfers are reminded to drive their buggy with care.

## GOLF ADMINISTRATION

### 3. CONTROL OF PLAY

- 3.1 Control of play shall be in accordance with such regulations as the Management may promulgate from time to time.
- 3.2 All players commencing a round of golf shall start from the first hole of each nine and shall play each hole thereafter, in proper sequence.
- 3.3 Play on weekdays, weekends and public holidays.

#### a. Weekdays

Members may have the option of playing 9 or 18 holes in the morning session only. However, 9-hole play shall be restricted from 7.07am (first flight) to 8.59am (last flight) and evenings from 4.27pm onwards, if 9-hole play is applicable on the said day.

\* WTGM – Weekday Term Golfing Membership

#### **b. Weekends and Public Holidays**

Only holders of official Handicap Index (HI) of 24.9 and below for men and, 36.9 and below for ladies are allowed to play on the course.

#### **4. PROFICIENCY CERTIFICATE (PC) HOLDERS**

PC holders are allowed to play as follows:

a. 18 holes on weekdays

b. 9 holes after 4.27pm daily

#### **5. HANDICAP INDEX (HI) RESTRICTIONS**

##### **5.1 Weekdays**

Male golfers are allowed to tee off from the white or blue tee while female golfers may tee off from either the white or red tee.

##### **5.2 Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays**

Only male golfers with HI of 18.0 and below are allowed to tee off from the blue tee while ladies with HI of 12.0 and below are allowed to play off from the white tees.

In the event that anyone in a flight with all male golfers has a HI above 18.0, the whole flight must tee off from the white tee; if anyone in a flight with all female golfers has a HI above 12.0, the whole flight must tee off from the red tee.

#### **6. FLIGHT WITH MALE & FEMALE GOLFERS**

When a flight consists of male and female golfers, golfers should tee off from their respective tees based on their handicaps, however, the flight should play from two different tees only.

#### **7. PROFICIENCY CERTIFICATE (PC) HOLDERS**

Male and female PC holders are required to play from the white tee and red tee respectively. Junior holders are required to play from the red tee.

#### **8. COMMENCEMENT OF PLAY**

**8.1** All players shall report to their respective tees at least 10 minutes before their tee-off time. Flights that arrive after their tee-off time will lose their turn. They will be allowed to tee off at the next available time slot or after all the flights on the timesheet have teed off.

**8.2** Tee-off shall be in the order of the full flight of players arriving at the tee box. Those who have completed 9 holes shall wait until all flights on the timesheet have teed off.

#### **9. DISCONTINUATION AND RESUMPTION OF PLAY**

**9.1** All players shall discontinue play immediately when the siren is sounded. Play shall resume only after the resume play siren is sounded.

**9.2** No player shall continue to play or resume play when play is under suspension. Players are required to remain in the shelters at all times.

**9.3** When the course is declared open for play after suspension, players are permitted to continue with their game. Please refer to item 10 below for crossover policy if flights are unable to cross over for their second 9-hole before commencement of the next session.

#### **10. MORNING & AFTERNOON TIMESHEET CROSS**

##### **OVER POLICY**

**10.1** Golfers playing in the morning timesheet must complete the first 9-hole and be ready to tee off on the first tee of the next 9-hole by 11.45am.

**10.2** On days where the course is opened for Night Golf, golfers playing in the afternoon timesheet must complete the first 9-hole and be ready to tee off on the first tee of the next 9-hole by 4.15pm.

**10.3** Golfers who fail to cross over by the above stipulated time as a result of slow play or inclement weather will not be permitted to cross over. The Starter's decision is final.

**10.4** Golfers should not skip holes in order to cross over in time.

#### **11. RAIN CHECKS**

Golfers who have teed off and are unable to complete their 9 or 18-hole game due to inclement weather, will not be given any rain checks.

#### **12. AUTHORITY OF MARSHALS AND STARTERS**

**12.1** Marshals and starters are authorised to monitor slow play, handicap restrictions and golf etiquette during control of play.

**12.2** Marshals are also authorised to take any golfer out of the course for any golf infringement. For example, not repairing divots, pitch marks on the green, not raking bunkers and properly attired.

**12.3** The Club may, in its absolute discretion and without prior notice or assigning any reasons, suspend or modify control of play for the purpose of meeting special contingencies.

#### **PACE OF PLAY**

#### **13. QUICK TIPS TO SPEED UP PLAY**

- Plan your shot while walking to your ball or while others are playing.
- Line up your putt when others are putting.
- Be ready to play when it is your turn.
- Walk briskly between shots.
- Walk directly to your golf ball; don't follow others unless assisting in a search.
- If driving/riding a buggy, take several clubs with you to your ball so you do not have to walk back to the buggy.
- Do not step off yardage for every single golf shot.
- Develop an eye for distance.
- Be efficient with pre-shot routine.
- Minimise the number of practice swings.
- Play a provisional ball if you think the original might be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds.
- Leave your clubs on the side of the putting green towards the next tee.
- Exit putting green promptly after holing out.
- Unless experienced, play the standard tees, not the championship tees.

#### **GOLF ETIQUETTE**

#### **14. PLAY YOUR PART TO MAKE GOLFING ENJOYABLE**

- Always play without delay and keep up with the group in front.
- Invite faster groups to play through.
- Do not move, talk or stand close to a player making a stroke.
- Do not step on another player's line of putt.
- Do not play until the group in front is out of the way.
- Shout a warning if your ball may hit someone.
- Repair divot holes and ball marks. Smooth footprints in bunkers.
- Do not drop clubs on the putting green or lean on your putter.
- Replace the flagstick carefully in an upright position.
- Leave the course in the condition in which you would like to find it.
- If your ball may be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds, you may play a provisional ball before you go forward to look for the original, provided you announce your intention to do so.
- Exit putting green promptly after holing out. Unless experienced, play the standard tees, not the championship tees.

#### **PROFICIENCY CERTIFICATION (PC) & HANDICAP COURTESY ROUND**

#### **15. GOLF WORKSHOP & PC TEST**

##### **a. PC Test**

Members who wish to play on the golf course must have at least an OCC PC or Handicap Card from SGA affiliated clubs or valid USGA handicaps issued by foreign clubs.

##### **b. Requirements for PC Test**

To be eligible for the PC test, a member must register with the Golf department to attend a Golf workshop conducted at OCC and pass a written theory test. The golfer will then be tested at the Driving Range and be able to hit the balls reasonably well and get the balls airborne using several clubs for several distances. A fee will be charged for the Golf workshop and for the PC test.

##### Golf Workshop Fees (subject to prevailing GST):

\$10.00 – OCC Gold/Silver/WTGM Member

\$15.00 – OCC Social Member

\$20.00 – Corporate Union Member/  
Term Corporate Golf

##### PC Test Fees (subject to prevailing GST):

\$10.00 – OCC Gold/Silver/WTGM Member

\$30.00 – OCC Social Member

\$40.00 – Corporate Union Member/  
Term Corporate Golf

On passing the PC test, a member may play as follow:

18-hole play on weekdays; 9-hole play after 4.27pm daily.

#### **c. Requirements for Handicap Courtesy Round**

To qualify for Handicap Courtesy Round, PC holders must meet the following prerequisites:

- Must be Golfing members of OCC (Individual/ Corporate/WTGM).
- Have attended the Golf workshop.
- Have submitted scorecards for handicap computation
- Showing a maximum handicap index of 24.9 for men and 36.9 for ladies.
- Ability to pitch, chip and putt.
- Have sufficient knowledge of the rules of Golf and most importantly, display proper golf etiquette.

#### **d. Bookings for PC and Handicap Courtesy Round**

#### **COMPETITION RULES**

- 16.1**
- All Club competitions shall be played in accordance with the rules of Golf currently adopted by the Royal & Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews (R&A), United States Golf Association (USGA), OCC Local Rules and Golf Bye-Laws.
  - In the event of a tie, the OCC countback system shall apply.
  - In the event of a sudden-death play-off, the order of the holes to be played shall be decided by the Tournament Director/ Captain.
  - A competition shall be valid when there is a minimum of 8 competitors per division.
  - The Tournament Director's decision on all Club competitions is final.
  - Players are advised to refer to the effective Condition of Competition posted on the notice board prior to the closing date.
  - The Organising Committee reserves the right to make any amendment to the Conditions of Competitions. Any decision or amendment made will be final.

#### **16.2 Handicap Index (HI)**

- The Club will only maintain one HI for its members as per rules of the USGA Handicapping System.
- Members with official HI are eligible to participate in all Club competitions.  
Male: HI 24.9 and below  
Female: HI 36.9 and below
- Players are responsible for the accuracy on the HI printed on their scorecard upon registration and prior to the start of the Competition. No changes may be made on the scorecard after it has been returned to the organisers after the competition.
- Players who have their HI maintained at more than one club shall register the lowest HI for the competition.

- e. The Tournament Director has the discretion to disqualify a participant from the competition following consultation with the Handicap Chairman or Captain (in absence of Handicap Chairman) if the player's HI does not reflect his true playing ability. This is after ascertaining the fact with the player, his flight mates and his Home Club.
- f. The Management has the right to ascertain that each player has a HI reflecting potential ability. The Management will adjust the player's handicap index based on Exceptional Tournament Scores.

### 16.3 Tournament Score

A "Tournament Score" is a score made in a competition. The score made in competitions are declared as "Tournament Score" or "T" score.

### 16.4 Entry and Entrance Fee

- a. The entrance fee of all Club competitions shall be determined by the Management. There shall be no refund of entry fee after the closing date for registration.
- b. After the draw for any competition has been made, members who wish to participate may put their names on the reserve list. The Management reserves the right to redraw in the event of any cancellation or when slots are available.

### 16.5 Registration

All competitors shall register and verify their handicap index at least 20 minutes before their starting time.

### 16.6 Starting Time

All competitors must report to the Starter 10 minutes before their starting time. Competitors are reminded of rules of golf 5-3.

### 16.7 Discontinuance of Play

In the event of inclement weather preventing any competitors from completing a round, rules of golf 5-7 shall apply.

### 16.8 OCC Countback System

- a. OCC countback system is based on the best score for the second nine in the following order:  
Last 9 holes (10 to 18),  
Last 6 holes (13 to 18),  
Last 3 holes (16 to 18),
- b. Hole-by-hole scores starting from hole 18 to the preceding holes. The countback is based on the lowest nett score for a nett event and the lowest gross score for a gross event.
- c. For a competition that is played over several rounds of 18 holes, the countback is based on the final round's total for 18 holes, then the preceding round's score and so on. If the daily scores are all identical, the final day's score based on the OCC countback system will apply.

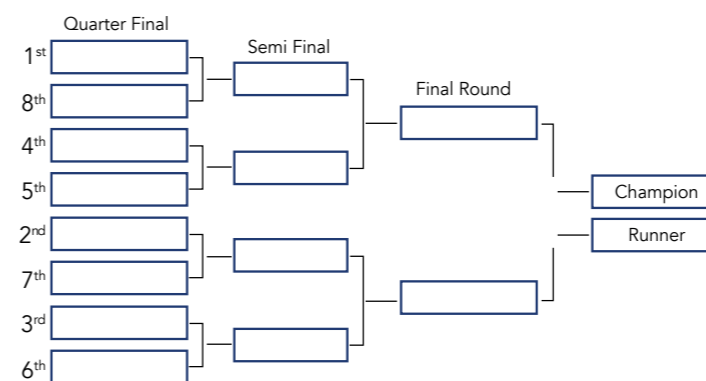
### 16.9 Use Of Distance Measuring Device (DMD) – Rule 14-3

- a. The use of DMD is allowed in competitions, unless otherwise stated. There must be no other features or applications installed in the DMD when the device is being used. If other features or applications are installed, it would be in breach of the Rules, whether or not the device is actually used.
- b. The following applications on DMD would not be allowed:
  - i. The gauging or measuring of slope.
  - ii. The gauging or measuring of other conditions that might affect play (i.e. wind speed or direction, or other climate-based information such as temperature, humidity etc.)
  - iii. Recommendations that might assist the player in making a stroke or in his play (i.e. club selection, type of shot to be played, green reading or any other advice related matter).
  - iv. Calculating the effective distance between two points based on slope or other conditions affecting shot distance.

## COMPETITIONS

### 17.1 Club Match Play Championships

- a. The Club Match Play Championship is open to members with official HI of 16.0 and below for men, and 18.4 and below for ladies, as at the closing date. Only members who have played a minimum of 4 Medals in the last 12 months prior to the date of the Match Play Championship is eligible to participate.
- b. The qualifying round will be played in conjunction with the Monthly Medal. The top 8 gross players of the Men's Medals and the top 8 gross players of the Ladies' Medals from the qualifying round will proceed to the first round.
- c. The Club Match Play Championship is played on an individual knockout system based on gross scores without handicap allowance. The winners of each round will proceed to the next round. If any round ends all square, that tie shall continue in the same sequence as the first 18 holes until one player has gained a hole.
- d. The scores of the Club Match Play Championship will be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by the Golf Office.
- e. Winners will be invited to complimentary dinner and prize presentation that will be held in conjunction with Hong Bao Golf Special Dinner.
- f. The draw is based on the USGA General Numerical Draw as follows (table for Club Match Play Championships)



### 17.2 Monthly Medal / Junior Medal

- a. This is an individual Stroke Play/Stableford competition for men, ladies and juniors with current HI in the following divisions:

Categories	Division	Handicap Index
Men	A	11.4 & below
	B	11.5 – 16.0
	C	16.1 – 24.9
Ladies	A	18.4 & below
	B	18.5 – 36.9
Juniors	-	36.9 & below

- b. Prizes will be awarded to the following:
  - i. Stroke Play - Best Gross, Best Nett and Runner-up Nett
  - ii. Stableford – Winner, 1st Runner-up and 2nd Runner-up
- c. The number of prizes for each division will be determined by the Tournament Director based on the number of participants
- d. The winners of the best gross and best nett in Stroke Play and the winner in Stableford play shall qualify for the Gold Medal.
- e. The scores of the Monthly Medals shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by Golf Office.

### 17.3 Gold Medal

- a. The competition is an individual nett Stroke Play over 18 holes held at the beginning of the year and is open only to Monthly Medal Winners in each division. Those eligible are the Winners of the Best Gross and Best Nett in Stroke Play, Winner in Stableford Play, and Winners who have played at least 4 Medals in the last calendar year. The Winners will be invited (with waiver of entry fee) to compete in the 2020 Gold Medal.

- b. Players are to play off their current HI or the HI (revised) in the month of their medal win, whichever is lower. In the event of a tie, the OCC countback system shall apply. Prizes will be awarded to the Champion and the Runner-up for the Men's and Ladies' divisions. They will be invited to complimentary dinner when they attend the prize presentation which will be held during the Hong Bao Golf Special Dinner.

- c. The scores of the Gold Medal shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by the Golf Office.

### 17.4 President's Cup

The format of this competition shall be determined by the Greens Committee. The scores of the President's Cup shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by Golf Office.

### 17.5 Captain & Lady Captain's Cup

The format of this competition shall be determined by the Greens Committee. The scores of the Captain & Lady Captain's Cup shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by Golf Office.

### 17.6 Men's Club Championship & Ladies' Club Championship

- a. The Men's Club Championship is open to men with current HI of 11.4 and below, and the Ladies' Club Championship is open to ladies with current HI of 18.4 and below. Only members who have played a minimum of 4 Medals in the last 12 months prior to the date of the Club Championship are eligible to participate.
- b. The Championships shall consist of 54 holes Stroke Play in three rounds of 18 holes each. There shall be no cut offs for the Championships. Pairings for the final round shall be based on scores, with the leading scores teeing off last. For the nett prizes, the HI to be used for every round shall be the current handicap at the beginning of the competition.
- c. In the event of a tie for the Championship, the winner shall be decided by a sudden-death play-off. In the event of a tie for other positions, the OCC countback system shall apply.
- d. Prizes will be awarded in the following order:
  - i. Champion, Runner-up, Overall Best Nett, Daily Best Gross and Daily Best Nett. They will be invited to complimentary dinner when they attend the prize presentation that will be held in conjunction with Hong Bao Golf Special Dinner.
  - ii. The Champion and the runner-up are not eligible for the Overall Best Nett Prize while the Daily Best Gross Winner shall not win the Daily Nett Prize.

- e. Late cancellation fees are only applicable for the first round of the competition.
- f. The scores of the Men's Club Championship & Ladies' Club Championship shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by Golf Office.

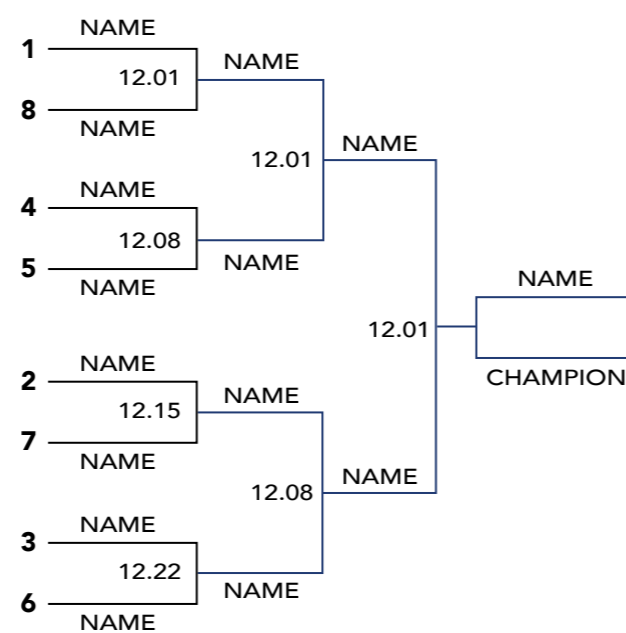
## 17.7 Hong Bao Golf Special

The format of this competition shall be determined by the Greens Committee.

## 17.8 Handicap Matchplay Championship

- a. The Handicap Matchplay Championship qualifying round will be played in conjunction with the Monthly Medal.
- b. The Handicap Matchplay Championship shall be held annually and is open to members with official HI 0 to 16.0 for men and 0 to 18.4 for ladies at the time of entries.
- c. Only members who have played a minimum of 4 Medals in the last 12 months prior to the Handicap Matchplay Championship are eligible to participate.
- d. The top 8 nett players of the Men's 'A' and/or 'B' and Ladies' 'A' Division respectively from the qualifying round will proceed to the first round of the Championship.
- e. In the event of a tie, the match shall continue in accordance with Golfing Bye-Laws 14 (14.15).
- f. The Winner shall be the Handicap Matchplay Champion for the year, and will be invited to complimentary dinner when attending the prize presentation that will be held during the Hong Bao Golf Special Dinner.
- g. The scores of the Handicap Matchplay Championship shall be posted as Tournament (T) scores via Central Handicapping System (CHS) by Golf Office.

- h. The draw is based on the USGA General Numerical Draw as follows (table for Handicap Matchplay Championship):



## 17.9 Secretary-General's Cup

The competition is an annual event between NTUC and OCC. It is open to OCC, affiliated and corporate union members with HI of 24.9 and below for men, and 36.9 and below for ladies.
