My team and I certainly look forward to another great year in serving your needs and wants, and to be a member-centric Club in strengthening our service standards through continuing improvement initiatives for the enjoyment of all members.

The beginning of the year also marked a significant milestone with the announcement on the acquisition of Raffles Country Club by the SLA with the last day of operations slated to end by 31 July 2018 to make way for the KL & Singapore High-Speed Rail project. CLUB BULLETIN TEE TALK

Major Cyclical Enhancement Works done in 2016 to Improve Energy Efficiency

Electrical Power Distribution System

Cyclical replacement of the Club's major electrical power distribution system (i.e. High Tension and Low Tension (HT & LT) Main Switchboards, Bar Bus, Transformers and Emergency Generator) was carried out to improve on the Club's overall energy efficiency and enhance safety on electrical installations.

Air Conditioning Distribution System

Air Handling Units (AHU), Fan Coil Units and Direct Expansion (DX) Air Conditioning Units in the Club were replaced with new energy efficient Air Conditioning Units. This replacement was done in hand with an upgraded Building Automation System (BAS) for better operation control and monitoring to enhance optimum performance.

Upcoming Projects

More enhancement plans are on the way this year to provide you and your families with the Orchid experience we aim to deliver. Two major upgrading projects have been scheduled. In the 2nd quarter of 2017, toilet renovation works will be carried out at the Driving Range, Orchid Lodge, Hotel Lobby, Aranda Lounge and Grand Ballroom Foyer. Hotel rooms will also be renovated for a refreshed look in the last guarter of 2017.

Regular Hollow Tinning and Coring **Exercises for a Healthy Green Turf**

Recently, the Golf Course Maintenance Team carried out Hollow Tinning and Coring on the Greens; and this is a necessary exercise because the soil of the Putting Greens can become compacted over time due to traffic from maintenance machines and footfall from golfers as well as excessive thatch build-up.

(Note: Thatch refers to a tightly intermingled layer of living and dead stems, leaves, roots and debris which accumulate between the layer of actively growing grass and the soil underneath.)

When the soil becomes compacted, the roots are deprived of nutrients and oxygen. Eventually, the grass will wither and die. In addition, the excessive thatch build-up will retain water in the upper profile of the soil leading to the Putting Greens turning soft as well as having pitch marks and bumpy surfaces.

Since the root zone forms a plant's life support system, it is vital to maintain a decent soil profile through regular Hollow Tinning and Coring for the grass roots to receive sufficient water and oxygen.



This photo shows the soil compaction which negatively affects the roots' performance.

Step 1: Hollow Tinning is first carried out where a powered mechanical vertical coring unit which consists of hollow tubes, is used to produce small holes on the Greens to create pore spaces for oxygen to penetrate the soil.

Step 2: A Sweeper will be used to remove the soil cores left on the surface after Hollow Tinning.

Steps 3 & 4: This is followed by topdressing the core holes with sand, creating a fresh growing medium to retain pore spaces and provide better water movement. This process produces a smooth, firm putting surface and reduces thatch build-up.

Step 5: Rolling is used as a finishing technique to ensure maximum smoothness to the Green putting surface, thus increasing ball-roll distance.

We thank you for your understanding and patience as the Club carries out these cultural practices periodically to improve the playability of the golf course for your golfing enjoyment.

Golf Rules & Etiquette

Safety

Recently, the Golf Department has received a number of reports on Dangerous Play situations on the Golf Courses. The Club would like to remind all golfers to exercise more caution to avoid any unpleasant and Dangerous Play situations. It is always the responsibility of the back flight to ensure that the golfers in the front flight are out of range before playing a stroke.

How to avoid Dangerous Play?

- Golfers should not play until all golfers in front are out of range.
- Shout a warning "FORE" if you think your ball might be in danger of hitting the golfers in front or at another hole. Your fellow golfers should also shout "FORE" to warn the golfers.
- You should shout "FORE" immediately and not only when the ball is about to land. This is to give the golfers enough time to move away from the ball. Getting hit by a golf ball can cause serious injuries, such as the loss of an eye, or even death.
- If unsure, always move forward to check the situation. Some golfers might be hidden from sight if they are searching for golf balls. A good habit to observe for such golfers is to leave a buggy or trolley prominently displayed on the fairway as a signal to the back flight that your flight is still there.
- If you are unsure on whether your shot might hit the front golfer, do not take the shot. This few seconds of waiting could save a life.

What to do when you have hit a Wayward Shot?

- Move forward immediately to apologise to the golfers and report to the Marshal.
- Should your shot unintentionally hit a golfer ahead, move immediately to render medical assistance and call the Club's Emergency Number at 6750 2173/ 174.






